2011-2012

Immediately following the 2011 Xi State Convention, the officers and related personnel met on campus to set a July date and place [Lynn Caruthers' home in Pulaski] for a special time to plan for the new biennium.

Southeast Regional Conference - Louisville, KY, July13-16, 2011

Louisville welcomed 76 members of Xi State to the Regional Convention. Many Tennessee members were actively involved in the convention. Becky Sadowski was in charge of training all the incoming state presidents; workshops were presented by Linda McCrary, Nancy Davis, Mildred Welch, Christy Crouse, and Dr. Elaine Alexander; workshop facilitators included Dee Dee Rives, Elaine Warwick, and Judy McDonald. Either leading, speaking, or providing music in the general meetings were Linda McCrary, Nancy Davis, Beverly Smith, Elaine Warwick, Dee Dee Rives, Marsha Brewer, Carlene Ford, Judy Jackson, Dr. Dorrie Powell, and Vera Jo Henegar. Fran Young and Judy Collins orchestrated the Xi State Reception; Wynona Clayborne and Irene Archambault were taking pictures. The Tennessee Breakfast was planned by Dr. Kathie Harned, the outgoing Corresponding Secretary.

Xi State Leadership Conference for Committee Planning September 16-17, 2011

One hundred and forty nine members were appointed to Xi State Committees and Area Director positions. In addition, new committees were established including 2016 DKG International Convention [to be held in Nashville] Steering Committee [Becky Sadowski – chair] and Educational Excellence Committee [Dr. Dorrie Powell – chair]. Only chairs were named at this time. The meeting was held at Crieve Hall Church of Christ with officers, related personnel, and committee chairs meeting on Friday night for advance planning, joined by the committee members on Saturday. The three tiers of the state were well represented as they diligently planned and made assignments for the biennium.

New Editor

On October 18, 2011, the Xi State Personnel Committee recommended the hiring of Orlean Bauman, Alpha Rho, as the editor of the Xi State News effective immediately. This recommendation was passed unanimously by the Xi State Executive Board.

Meeting at University of the South

Dr. Kathie Harned, Dr. Dorrie Powell, and Dr. Elaine Alexander met with the University of the South personnel Monday, January 16, 2012, to plan the 2012 Xi State Convention.

Legislative Symposium 2012:

On February 21, over 100 Delta Kappa Gamma members from across Tennessee attended the annual Legislative Symposium at the Millennium Maxwell House in Nashville. Dr. Kathie Harned, Xi State President, opened the evening event by presenting the audience of experienced and passionate educators to the panel of decision makers. The panel consisting of Sen. Jim Kyle, Sen. Brian Kelsey, Deputy Commissioner of Education Kathleen Airhart, TEA's Government Relations Manager Jerry Winters, and Tennessee Retired Teachers Association's Executive Director Ron Pendergrass led a discussion of current "hot topics" in Tennessee education including the controversial evaluation process. New at this symposium, members submitted questions in advance. Dr. Kay Awalt Musgrove (Rho), moderated the panel, The following morning, 75 Xi State members attended breakfast with Commissioner of Education Kevin S. Huffman. In his keynote address, Commissioner Huffman stressed his deep belief that education in Tennessee will continue to improve and grow. After breakfast, members went to "the Hill" to attend a session of the Senate/House Education Committee meeting and to visit their legislators.

2012 Chapter Officer Training

The training for the incoming Chapter Presidents, Membership Chairs, Program/Educational Excellence Chairs, Treasurers, and Website/Communication Chairs was held at three different sites across the state.

March 10, 2012 – Whitworth-Buchanan, Murfreesboro

March 24, 2012 – Bolivar Central High School, Bolivar

March 31, 2012 – Trinity United Methodist Church, Knoxville

Training included sessions for incoming chapter presidents on how to conduct an effective chapter meeting, growing membership, Educational Excellence, website development, and sessions for chapter treasurers on financial responsibilities. Materials were provided for all in attendance. Sixty-five of the seventy-six Xi State Chapters were represented. Those incoming Chapter Presidents who could not attend were invited to training at Xi State.

Young DKG's

Dr. Harned requested chapters to ask their younger members to attend a sharing session during the new officer trainings across the state at the same time as the Officer Trainings. A good number of young members [age 40 years or younger] in each tier of the state participated on the designated Saturday morning. The younger members facilitated the meetings with ground rules that were to be honest – and they were. They offered wonderful ideas and suggestions from how/where to invite younger members to how to involve and keep them. These ideas were shared with chapter presidents as well

as in a workshop in New York. DKG represents various generations and all approach life differently; it is vital to embrace all members and value their contributions.

Leadership Management

Former Southeast Regional Director and member of the International Educational Excellence Committee Cathy Daughtery convened the Xi State Leadership Management “Boot Camp” on March 16th at St. Columba Retreat Center near Memphis. Participants were informed about a number of leadership issues including how to work effectively with people who are of a different personality type, how parliamentary procedure can keep chapter meetings running smoothly and productively, and how to create a perfect “elevator speech” to let others know about Delta Kappa Gamma.

Alpha Chapter’s 75th Anniversary

Dr. Harned left the Leadership Management Training in Memphis early Sunday morning, March 18th, and drove to Chattanooga to celebrate with Alpha Chapter the 75th anniversary of their founding as the first Xi State Chapter.

Xi State Convention

June 7-9, 2012

Honoring outstanding members, showcasing chapters’ talents, raising money for worthy causes, enjoying great musical numbers, and sharing new ideas were just a few of the highlights of the 2012 Xi State Convention at the University of the South in Sewanee. Over 300 members were in attendance representing 63 of our 76 chapters plus International President Dr. Jensi Souders (Alpha Phi) and Southeast Regional Director Libby Watson (Alabama). New and veteran members spent time celebrating our Order of the Rose recipients, incoming chapter presidents, and 50 year members as well as attending a variety of workshops. The Birthday Brunch featured “Hats Off to DKG” as most all members wore their special hats to create a festive affair.

In addition, members conducted Society business by voting to bring our state committees’ structure into line with International committees. Earlier the Executive Board approved to dissolve Epsilon Chapter [August 15, 2011]. Beta Chi Chapter reorganized [May 15, 2012] and became Gamma Omicron Chapter.

The theme of the President’s Banquet was, “New York, New York,” as members excitedly anticipated the upcoming International Convention that our own International President, Dr. Jensi Souders, would host in New York City.

Iris Circle

The Past Xi State Presidents were inducted into the newly created Iris Circle at the Xi State Convention in June 2012. The circle represents the demonstrated unity, closeness, and never-ending commitment to Xi State as well as the unity and wholeness of the members. The pin awarded to a member was designed by Dr. Kathie Harned. We are grateful to our Iris Circle Members for their continued outstanding leadership and dedication to Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and to Xi State.

2012 Golden Gift Seminar, Austin, Texas

Jennifer Lusk [Beta Xi], Michelle Steen [Theta], and Dr. Kathie Harned [Beta Upsilon] were selected, attended and graduated from the 2012 International Leadership Management Seminar.

New York DKG Convention, July 24-28, 2012

Over seventy Tennessee members attended the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Convention in New York City. It was an extremely special time for Xi State members as our own Dr. Jensi Souders, current DKG International President, served as the hostess for the event. A number of members presented workshops and participated in the various events.

Dr. Harned, as a member of the Executive Board, voted to expand DKG into Japan, to raise the International scholarship amount for those working on their doctorate to \$10,000, and to include Early Career Educators as an International Project. She carried

the International Flag at the Opening Session [an honor for the President of the International President's state].

Xi State hosted Dr. Souder's reception at Rosie O'Grady's. Over 130 guests braved the weather and took time to visit with our International President. Words cannot express the gratitude and appreciation for Dr. Jensi Souders not only in her leadership with International, but also the sharing of her wisdom and insight with the current Xi State President.

At the SE Regional Breakfast a very deserving Rosalene Coleman [Phi] was named as our Star of the Southeast. Rosie, as her Xi State sisters fondly call her, is one of the pillars of Phi Chapter as well as of Xi State and represents the kind of selfless leadership which results from deep devotion and dedication to Delta Kappa Gamma.

Creative Arts Retreat

The biennial Creative Arts Retreat was held September 21-22, 2012, in Collierville, TN. Over 60 members from across the state participated in knitting, crocheting, storytelling, flower making, cake decorating, creative movement, stamping, bird watching, and cross stitching. Mary K. Bradfield [Beta Gamma] chaired the committee that orchestrated the successful event.

Leadership Development

The second Beginning Leadership Management Seminar of the biennium was held on October 12-14, 2012, at Hachland Hills Vineyard and Corporate Retreat Center in Joelton, Tennessee. The presenter was Cathy Daugherty, Iota State (Virginia), a former Southeast Regional Director and current member of the International Educational Excellence Committee. Topics presented included: personality types, netiquette, listening skills, parliamentary procedure, elevator speeches, as well as conducting a *Go to Meeting*. These topics and more drew fourteen Xi State sisters from across the state to the second entry-level Leadership Management Seminar of this biennium.

Meeting at University of the South

Dr. Kathie Harned, Dr. Dorrie Powell, and Dr. Elaine Alexander met with the University of the South personnel Monday, January 21, 2013, to plan the 2012 Xi State Convention. Beverly Smith, nominee for 2013-2015 Xi State President and Lynn Caruthers, nominee for 2013-2015 2nd Vice-President, were also invited to observe and participate.

Legislative Symposium 2013

The Xi State 2013 Legislative Symposium was held on February 19-20 at the Millennium Maxwell House in Nashville. Approximately 90 Delta Kappa Gamma members from Xi State chapters across Tennessee attended the event. The panel of educational decision makers included : Tennessee State Representative and Chair of the House Finance, Ways and Means Committee, Charles Sargent; TEA President Gera Summerford; TEA's Tennessee Retired Teachers Association's Executive Director Ron Pendergrass; and Tennessee Department of Education Assistant Commissioners, Stephen M. Smith and Aneesh Sohoni. A number of topics were discussed, including charter schools and vouchers, retirement issues, teacher evaluations, and school safety. Dr. Kay Awalt Musgrove [Rho Chapter] again moderated the panel discussion by presenting questions submitted by DKG members. The next day, approximately 70 DKG members attended an early morning breakfast at the hotel. Keynote speaker Dr. Kathleen Airhart, Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Education, addressed the group. After breakfast, DKG members went to "The Hill" to attend sessions of the Senate and House Education Committees and to visit their legislators.

Xi State Advanced Leadership Seminar

The Advanced Leadership Seminar was held March 1-3, 2013, at Hachland Vineyard, Joelton, Tennessee. Past Xi State President Becky Sadowski led 14 graduates of the Beginning Leadership Seminar in ways to grow leadership skills. This seminar was conducted in a paperless format, using technology to promote environmental awareness and to decrease expenses.

2013 Xi State Convention June 6-8, 2013

The 2013 Xi State Convention included beloved traditions of the Order of the Rose, President's Banquet, and Ceremony of Remembrance; however, a few changes added spice to this year's gathering. On Thursday night, after Beta Rho member and storyteller Sheila Hickman shared humorous stories about Tennessee history, members enjoyed, for the first time, state committee displays highlighting their work. A buffet offered more variety to those attending the Awards Luncheon, and the loss of Lower Cravens due to campus construction moved the new officer receiving line to Upper Cravens following the President's Banquet, replacing the traditional dessert reception. With 284 members in attendance, representing 64 chapters, we welcomed International Second Vice-President Dr. Lyn B.
