Dr. Jensi Souders, Southeast Regional Director, planned a wonderful conference that was attended by seventy-two Xi State members. Prior to the conference, a pre-conference seminar entitled "Sell Your Success" was presented by Dr, Fancy Funk of Florida State University. Elaine Warwick served as registrar for the seminar.

Many Xi State members had a vital role in the success of the conference. Eight Xi State members served as workshop facilitators. Vera Jo Henegar (Pi) and Linda McCrary were busy throughout the conference with drawings and auctions for the International Emergency Fund. Dr. Jensi Souders presided at the First General Session. At the Celebration Luncheon, Nancy Davis, Becky Sadowski and Elaine Warwick modeled items donated by past international presidents. Prior to the auction, Xi State members pooled their money so they could bid on selected items. Dr. Kathie Harned bid and purchased a beautiful beaded gown for Nancy Davis donated by Dr. Irene Murphy (PA) and purchased a handbag for Dr. Jensi Souders. Nancy wore the gown at the President's Banquet. At the Luncheon Nancy Davis, Dr. Dorrie Powell and Elaine Warwick presented a story of wisdom and passion based on the first verse of the Delta Kappa Gamma song.

Many members shared their musical talents by singing in the chorus at the President's Banquet. Dr Annette Gregory (Alpha Beta) and Ernestine Eldridge (Alpha Xi) played the piano at general sessions. The keynote speaker at the President's Banquet was the dynamic and energetic Eloise Litz (Alpha Xi). Elaine Warwick had the honor of introducing Eloise. Becky Sadowski introduced the in-coming and out-going presidents.

This was a very special conference for Nancy for two reasons; she was introduced as the new state president on June 30 with her official duties to begin July 1. The dates were perfect! She also shared the conference with her dad, Tom Farris.

July 13, 2007 was Nancy's first official visit as Xi State President. The meeting was at the home of Ann Arnold in Bristol where Alpha Alpha was having their summer tea. It was very fitting that Nancy's first chapter visit be with Alpha Alpha because when she became a member of Delta Kappa Gamma in 1988, she was a member of Alpha Alpha Chapter.

The 2007 **European Regional Conference** was held July 26-August 5. Nancy Davis, Janice Jolley (Gamma Zeta), Mary Evelyn Perkinson and Dee Dee Rives represented Tennessee at Strawberry Hills, Great Britain. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet sisters from all over

the world and to see how another conference was organized. All four ladies took part in all aspects of the conference. Nancy was invited to sing on two occasions by International President, Dr. Barbara Day (NC).

The 2007 **Xi State Leadership Conference for State Committee Planning** took place at the Holiday Inn in Brentwood September 28-29. The weekend incorporated Nancy's theme of climbing a mountain and reaching many goals. In addition to all standing committees, the Strategic Planning Task Force and the 75th Anniversary Task Force were added. 148 members of the 175 members assigned to committees, elected state officers and related personnel were in attendance. The three grand divisions of the state were well represented. Nancy gave each committee charges for the biennium which they discussed and then reported on at the end of the conference. Many committees incorporated the biennium theme in their goals as well as came up with new ideas to carry out the theme.

Something unique about this president is how far east Nancy lives in the state. That along with being a full-time educator did not give her the luxury of traveling to chapter meetings on all days of the week. Chapters were wonderful to have special Saturday meetings and to invite many chapters to the meeting. Since Memphis is as far west as Mountain City is east, Nancy decided to fly to the October 20 meeting in Memphis. It took less time and cost less than if she had driven across the state! She was also able to spend more time with chapter members.

January 20, 2008, Nancy, Dee Dee Rives and Beverly Smith met on the campus of the University of the South in Sewanee with University personnel to **plan the 2008 Xi State**Convention. These ladies came a day early so they could attend church services at All Saint's Chapel.

Beth Petty (Beta Upsilon) and committee planned the 2008 **Legislative Symposium** which met February 5-6 at the Millenium Maxwell House Hotel in Nashville. Tuesday night 100 members and guests heard comments from Dr. Gary Nixon, Executive Director of the State Board of Education and Jerry Winters, Tennessee Education staff member. After the meeting horrific thunderstorms and a tornado swept through the area. Many Xi State sisters found themselves in the safety of a room on the main floor.

Wednesday morning's weather was much calmer! Members enjoyed a delicious buffet breakfast and comments from Dr. Mary Jo Howland, Deputy Executive Director of the State Board of Education. After the meeting members visited their local legislators and sessions of the Education Committees of the House and Senate.

In late fall 2007 Nancy was contacted by International President, Dr. Barbara Day about helping to sponsor a **new state organization**, **Estonia**. The Xi State executive board unanimously voted to support Estonia financially. Nancy wanted to go one step further by representing Tennessee in person. On March 5th she flew with Dr. Day to Estonia. There they joined three other ladies from the United States, Dr. Hanna Fowler (GA), Dr Dolly Price (CA) and Marilyn Stalder- Burke (CA). Together the ladies explored the historic town of Tallinn taking in the cuisine and culture.

March 8, 2008, International Women's Day, Estonia became our newest state organization. Four ceremonies actually took place in the National Library against a backdrop of falling snow outside; the installation of the state organization, chapter installation, initiation of new members and chapter officer installation. Each ceremony was beautiful and was celebrated by 15 sisters from many of the European countries and 5 sisters from America. Amid all the ceremonies there was eating and much toasting. Many countries presented a gift to Alpha Chapter. Tennessee presented each lady of the chapter a sachet filled with a pin of the state of Tennessee and a gold rose medallion with "Xi State 3/8/08" engraved on the back. The next day when Nancy visited a new member at her school, she was wearing the medallion. She said she was wearing it close to her heart.

It was quite a statement for the educators of Estonia to join an international organization since they had only been a free county for 10 years. The sisters of Estonia will always be very special to Xi State. It is an honor to have been able to help support the start of a new state organization.

Judy Jackson (Rho), Barbara Morgan (Omega) and Elaine Warwick attended the **National Legislative Seminar** in Washington, D.C.

The New Chapter Officers Training was held April 11-12, 2008 at the Holiday Inn in Brentwood. Forty-six presidents, twenty-nine first vice-presidents, thirteen treasurers and sixteen recording secretaries were present. Area Directors met with the presidents in their area. State officers and related personnel attended the meetings bringing the total to 128 members from 51 chapters. The members participated in group sessions and breakout sessions centered around the theme; Working Together...Team Leadership. Each president was given updated written information for her handbook and received information from officers, related personnel and committee chairs. Area Directors received a completely new handbook. All in attendance received vital information to assist them as they serve in their chapter.

The Park Vista Hotel in Gatlinburg was the setting for the **Xi State Leadership Management Seminar** which was held April 25-27, 2008. The theme for the seminar was;

Climb Your Mountain, Reach Your Leadership Goals. Dr. Hanna Fowler (GA) was the presenter for the seminar. The Seminar was expanded to three days to give participants the time to really assimilate the information given to them as well as to get to know the ladies in their class. All participated in large group activities as well as small group activities. Saturday night the ladies enjoyed a night on the town. The whole weekend was geared toward learning and reinforcing leadership styles and becoming a team of future Xi State leaders.

The **2008 Xi State Convention** was held on the campus of the University of the South in Sewanee June 5-7. International Representative was Sheila MacKay, Canada. She is one of Nancy's Golden Gift sisters. Other guests were Faye Bedwell, Alabama State President and Libby Watson, Immediate Past Alabama State President. Dee Dee Rives planned many wonderful workshops and Beverly Smith and the Steering Committee coordinated every aspect of the convention beautifully. The design on the cover of the booklets was drawn by Alex Pille, a sophomore majoring in Innovative Design Engineering at Purdue University. Corey Blackburn, a student of Orlean Bauman (Alpha Rho) designed the banner that hung during the convention.

Seventeen chapters have internationally approved websites. Tennessee was third in the Society for having the most chapter websites preceded only by Texas and Georgia! Mr. Claiborne Gayden spoke at the Awards Luncheon about the League of Extraordinary Teens as Xi State continued to support the Books From Birth program. Thirteen ladies were honored with the Order of the Rose. The number was smaller in keeping with our twelve founders. At the President's Banquet chapter presidents were introduced by their Area Director and sat in areas instead of in Greek order. Nancy felt this was an opportunity for the presidents to visit and get to know one another. Dr. Jensi Souders was honored and thanked for her work as Xi State Executive Secretary and wished well as in-coming International First Vice-President.
